

Nevada Sexual Assault Statistics

- Once every 8 hours and 38 minutes, someone is raped in Nevada.
- Since 2002, the number of rates occurring annually in the Nevada has increased by 67%.

Uniform Crime Data

Number of victims recorded 2005: 1,016

Forcible rape is defined by the FBI as “the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults and attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are excluded”. This definition of rape is extremely limited, excluding male victims of sexual assault, incidents where physical force was not used, victims raped by family members, and only counting victims of vaginal/penile penetration.
